Weekly Program



Last week Warren Hartzman introduced Greg Marks as our guest speaker.

Greg has a passion for weather. It started when he was in the Kinnelon area. Kinnelon is about 1000 feet above sea level. Elevation plays a big part in weather. There were a few big storms in the late 1970s and early 1980s. It was also when the Weather Channel came out which had a profound impact on him in terms of forecasting weather.

He did not go into forecasting as a career but he has taken college classes. In 2010 he started writing weekly forecasts for friends and family. In 2012 he forecasted Hurricane Sandy two weeks before it happened. Since then, his write-ups started to grow and he has followers from Rhode Island to Virginia. He is on Twitter and Facebook. The weather community is open to people like Grea, so he has followers like Lee Goldberg (WABC TV), Janice Huff (WNBC TV), Dave Curren (News 12 NJ), Jim Cantore (Weather Channel)... He is also a volunteer for the National Weather Service as a SKYWARN® Storm Spotter. He gathers weather data for forecasting.

Greg has a high end weather station in his house. All of the data from that station gets distributed online. During recent wind gusts, his station measured a 40 mph gust. His 16 year old son is getting involved chasing storms and recording storm fronts rolling in using time lapse with his GoPro.

Why is the weather forecast always wrong? All weather forecasts are driven using one model, the Global Forecast System (GFS) weather forecast model (American model). The model does not forecast the weather. They are created with physics and data that pumps into them and they can be wrona. The forecaster needs to interrupt what the models do. Some models are inherently biased during certain seasons. Some are better closer in. Some are better further out. The European model is a lot more accurate but is also wrong sometimes. During the latest snow storms, the European models tended to forecast the storms further west and the GFS model tended to forecast the storms further east. Also, it is easier to forecast the weather out west in the plains than New Jersey. New Jersey has elevations and the ocean which affect the weather. Weather will do what it wants to do. A 50 mile shift in a storm, which is relatively small, can make the difference between some areas receiving three inches of snow and some areas receiving six inches of snow.

There is also a Japanese model and a Canadian model. There are short term models which have a 6 hour forecast.

Greg looks at temperatures in the South East Pacific ocean (La Niña and El Niño) which drives a tremendous amount of change in the North East. He also looks at weather patterns west of us and the jet stream.
